Page 34-35, Section VI - PITCHERS, (c) League age 9-10 (75 pitches per day), league age 11-12 (85 pitches per day), (d) addresses rest requirements

Page 39, Section XIV - FIELD DECORUM (b) Dugout, batboys batgirls, etc., (d) At least 1 adult in dugout, (e) alcohol and tobacco, (f) managers and coaches shall not warm up pitchers

Page 46, Section 1.06, NOTE 1 - impact of a runner breaks a base loose

Page 47, Section 1.08 NOTE 2 - Only the first batter of each half inning will be permitted outside the dugout between half-innings

Page 47, Section 1.10 NOTE 1 - The traditional batting donut is not permissible

Page 48, Section 1.11 (3) - Any part of the pitcher's undershirt or T-shirt exposed to view shall be of solid color. A pitcher shall not wear any items on his/her hands, wrist or arms which may be distracting to the batter. NOTE: White long sleeve shirts are not permitted

Page 48, Section 1.11 (j) - Players must not wear watches, rings, pins, jewelry or other metallic items. (EXCEPTION: Jewelry that alerts medical personnel to a specific condition is permissible.)

Page 48, Section 1.11 (k) - Casts may not be worn during the game

Page 48, Section 1.15 (a)-(c) - pitchers and gloves

Page 49, Section 1.17 - All male players must wear athletic supporters. Male catchers must wear the metal, fibre or plastic type cup

Pages 52-54, Section 2.00 DEFINITIONS OF TERMS - Interference, Obstruction and Pitch Return

Page 56-57, Section 3.09 - Players, managers and coaches of the participating teams shall not address or mingle with spectators, nor sit in the stands during a game...

Page 57, Section 3.17 - Participants in the dugout and on the field, a manager and not more than 2 coaches, electronic communication devices, etc.

Page 58, Section 3.17 NOTE 1 - In Tee Ball and non-competitive Minor Leagues, all players may be given a defensive position...
